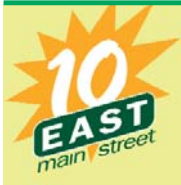
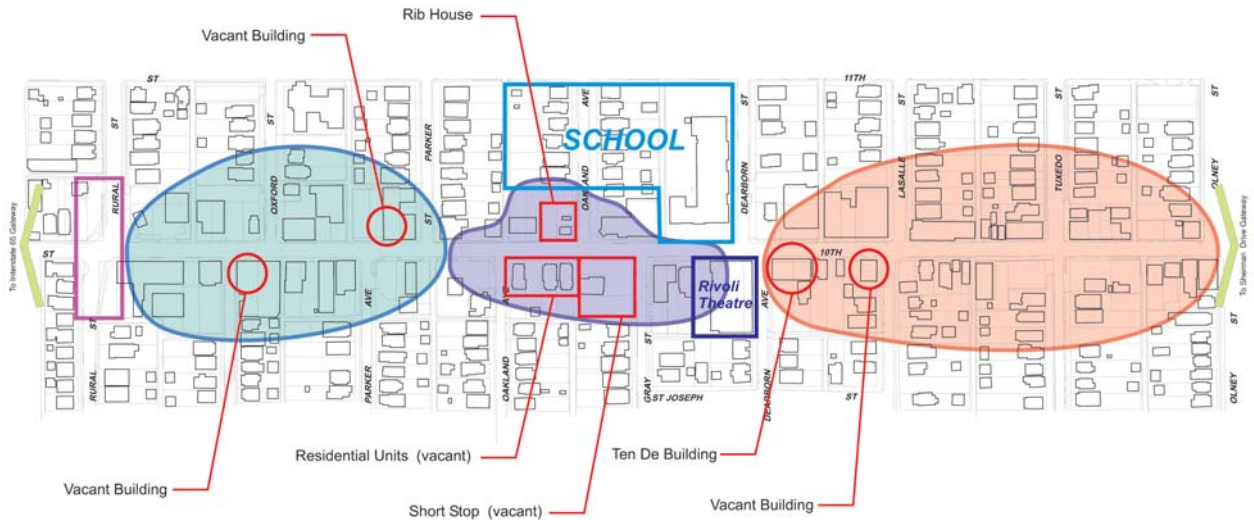

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Why 10 East Main Street?

- 10 East Main Street offers a diverse mix of commercially-zoned properties considered architecturally significant and/or located at key intersections on the corridor.
- Business and property owners, as well as developers, can benefit from a number of resources offered by the East 10th Street Civic Association including specialized loan programs, build-out assistance, rental assistance, tenant recruitment assistance, façade improvement programs and rezoning assistance.
- Since 2003, more than \$450,000 (public and private funds) have been invested in the corridor project. This funding has provided for the facilitation of five real estate development projects; completion of more than 15 façade or business signage improvement projects; and the support of more than 10 new businesses.
- Business owners can utilize 10 East Main Street district marketing, promotion and advertising strategies.
- Strong and committed community support for 10 East Main Street Business Community.

- 73,000+ residents live in five-minute driving radius of 10 East Main Street making up more than 15 established and organized neighborhood associations.
